

From the Pastor's Desk

Advent (coming)

Advent is the liturgical season of four weeks devoted to preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas.

The coming to earth is an event of such immensity that God willed to prepare for it over centuries. God makes everything converge on Christ: all rituals and sacrifices, figures and symbols of the "First Covenant." God announces Jesus through the mouths of prophets who succeeded one another in Israel. Moreover, God awakens in the hearts of pagans a dim expectation of His coming.

St. John the Baptist is the Lord's immediate precursor or forerunner, sent to prepare His way. "Prophet of the Most High," John surpasses all the prophets, of whom he is the last. John inaugurates the Gospel, already from his mother's (Elizabeth) womb welcomes the coming of Christ, and rejoices in being the "friend of the bridegroom," whom he points out as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" ((Jn 1:29). Going before Jesus "in the spirit and power of Elijah," John bears witness to Christ in his preaching, by his Baptism of conversion, and through his martyrdom.

When the Church celebrates the *liturgy of Advent* each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation of the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for His second coming. By celebrating the precursor's birth and martyrdom, the Church unites herself to John the Baptist's desire: "He must increase, but I must decrease" (Jn 3:30).

May we all have a holy Advent Season as we prepare to celebrate the Incarnation (birth in the flesh) of Christ at Christmas, Christ's coming into our hearts as we await Christ's final coming in the Parousia, when He will judge the world and all His followers who await Jesus will be one, in the one God.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (RE)


<u>Religious education classes for grades 1-10 are</u> <u>held at St. Patrick's Church on Wednesdays from 6-7</u> <u>pm.</u>
