Greetings in Christ!

The article from last week continues and finishes here. Again, here are some of the highlights of the document...for the sake of emphasis, the most

critical passages are printed in bold:

The Church continues to prefer the practice of burying the bodies of the deceased, because this shows greater esteem towards a the deceased. Nevertheless. cremation is not prohibited. When, for legitimate motives. cremation of the body has been chosen, the ashes of the faithful must be laid to rest in a sacred place, that is, in a cemetery or, in certain cases, in a church or an area which has been set aside for this purpose. It prevents the faithful departed from being forgotten, or their remains from being shown a lack of respect, which eventuality is possible, most especially once the immediately subsequent generation has, too, passed away. Also, it prevents any unfitting or superstitious practices.


The conservation of the ashes of the departed in a domestic residence is not permitted. The ashes may not be divided among various family members.

In order that every appearance of pantheism, naturalism or nihilism be avoided, it is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way, nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects.

May the souls of the faithful departed rest in God's peace! God bless you!


